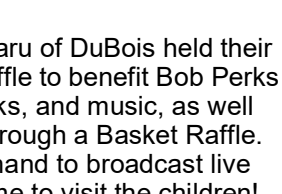
BPF Board Votes to Expand

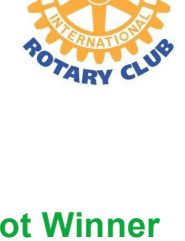
"Share the Love" Basket Raffle

Holiday Cash Giveaway Jackpot Winner



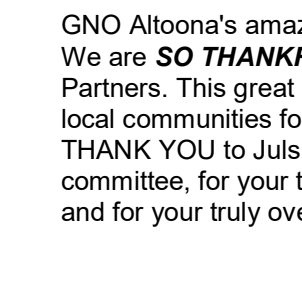

GNO Altoona Check Presentation

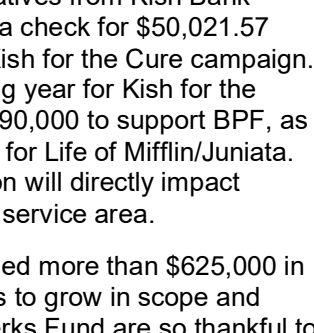

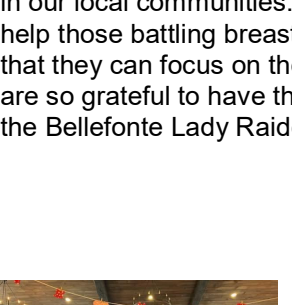

Kish for the Cure Check Presentation

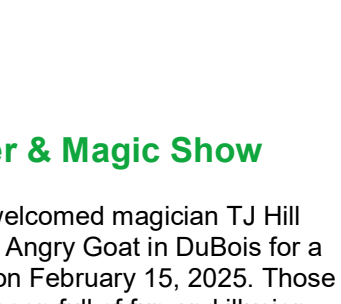

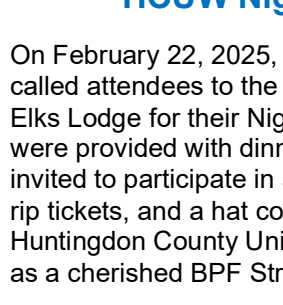
Bellefonte Lady Raiders Pink Out Event

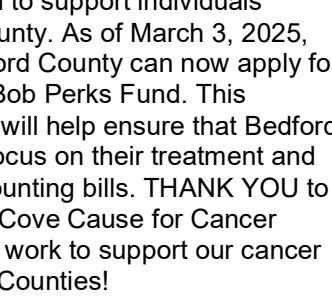
DAUW Winter Wonder & Magic Show

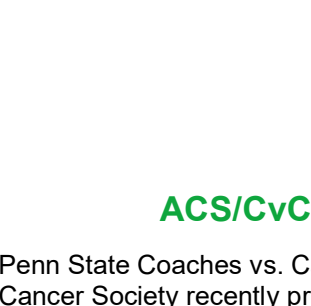
HCUW Night at the Races

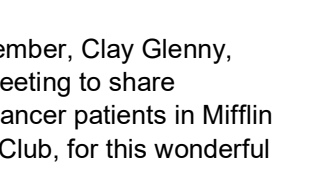
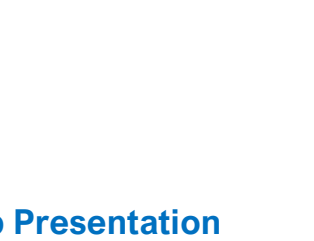
Cove Cause for Cancer \$10,000 Donation

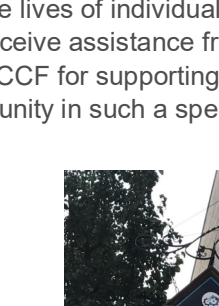


ACS/CvC Donation

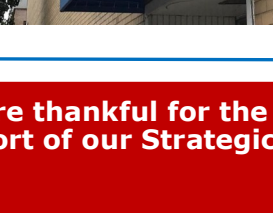
